Year 2021/2021 (January 2021 till December 2021)

Project goals

Goal 1 - To maintain membership of IDF by paying the membership fees of IDF and IMP before 31 March 2021 at the best possible exchange rates

Achievements

The membership fee of R807 899 was paid in November 2020 due to the advance facility provided by Milk SA. This facility enabled the National Committee to pay the membership fee just after it was determined by the General Assembly on 2 November 2020 and thereby avoided the problem of foreign exchange losses that were often experienced in the past.

Goal 2 - Review SA representatives on IDF bodies (SC'S, AT'S etc.) so that the best-qualified persons can represent SA on these bodies

Achievements

On his request, Dr. Jan Floor was replaced by Mr. Stephan Steyn as primarius member of the SC Dairy Science and Technology. Due to his resignation as MPO CEO, Dr. Chris van Dijk resigned as SA's primarius member of SC Farm Management and SC Animal Health and Welfare. Due to the fact that the restructuring of MPO was still in progress at the time, the Executive Committee of SANCIDF resolved at their 30 August 2021 meeting to appoint Mr. Fanie Ferreira, Acting CEO of MPO, as temporary SA representative on the SC Farm Management. At the same meeting they also resolved to appoint Dr. Martin van der Leek, secundus member of SC Animal Health and Welfare, as primarius member of this SC. Towards the end of the fourth quarter a new CEO in the person of Mr. Gerhard Kriel was appointed by MPO and a new representative on SC Farm Management will have to be sought in 2022.

Goal 3 - Ensure appropriate and timely (before set deadlines) inputs by SANCIDF and SA representatives on IDF bodies to IDF

Achievements

IDF adopted 11 New Work Items (NWI) for 2021. They were:

- Revision of ISO 26323 IDF 213 Milk products
- Heat Stress In Dairy Cattle
- Aflatoxin M1
- C56 Guidance for fat determination by NMR
- Revision ISO 27205 IDF 149
- Revision of IDF ISO standard for scorched particle
- Use of molecular methodologies in the dairy industry
- Ecosystem Services
- Food Additive Cocktail Effect
- Role of food cultures in health
- Sustainable indicators

All eleven were approved by the SANCIDF and confirmation from IDF that all members approved these NWI's was received on 22 March 2021.

The following Questionnaires were processed during the year:

- 0121/SCAMC - Cheese — Guidance on sample preparation for physical and chemical testing.
- 0221/SCAMAC - Guidelines for the validation of qualitative screening methods for the detection of residues of veterinary drugs in milk and milk products - ISO/TS 23758|IDF RM 251. IDF informed member countries on 6 July that a majority of replying IDF members endorsed publication of a joint ISO Technical Specification|IDF Reviewed Method on Guidelines for the validation of qualitative screening methods for the detection of residues of veterinary drugs in milk and milk products.
- 0321/SCMH- Inventory of Microbial Food Cultures with safety demonstration in fermented food products. Revision of the 2018 published rationale and available taxonomic updates in order to update the inventory of microbial food cultures. Simultaneously, a questionnaire was sent to all IDF National Committees for submission of new species based on the published scientific rationale. Approval is requested for the publication of the attached papers as a bulletin of the IDF
- 0421/SCDST_SCMH- Heat Treatments of Milk, Approval is requested for publication of the Bulletin.
- 0521/SCAMC - Milk, dried milk products and cream — Determination of fat content – Gravimetric method for Standard ISO/DIS 23318|IDF 249/2021

The following other requests for information were received from IDF:

- A request for input in the Special Edition of the IDF Dairy Sustainability Outlook 2021 for the UN Food System Summit (processed by Dr. Colin Ohlhoff).
- Comments on IDF Strategy 2022-2025 (National Secretary responded)
- For information, a note prepared by the IDF Board providing general principles for IDF potential work on cell-based, laboratory made dairy ingredients analogues. (Only for information therefore SA did not respond)

Goal 4 - Promote the forthcoming Global Dairy Conference amongst dairy industry role-players by forwarding all promotional e-mails to MPO/Sampro/DAFF representatives and South African SC members as well as articles about the GDC in industry publications

Achievements

The IDF Global Dairy Conference (GDC) was held in Copenhagen on 13 to 15 October 2021 where world dairy experts gathered in person. or on-line.

One Press Release on 30 August informing the dairy community that registration was open for This press release was sent to all industry members involved with SANCIDF and they were asked to inform their colleagues of the event.

One Newsbrief on 4 October reminding the dairy community to register online for the Global Dairy Conference. This Newsbrief was sent to all industry members involved with SANCIDF and again, they were asked to inform their colleagues of the event.

Goal 5 - To enable a delegation of four SANCIDF officials to take part in the Global Dairy Conference

Achievements

At their August meeting the E.C. decided to make four online registrations, one for Cape Town and three for Pretoria to cover the three concurrent sessions running on the last two days. Included in these registrations were the opportunity to view all of the presentations delivered at the GDC for a year after the conference. The four registrations were made to accommodate not only Executive Committee and Standing Committee members but also industry-leaders and members. However, very few of these members made use of these opportunities.

Goal 6 - Delegates to the GDC to give meaningful feed-back to the local dairy industry within one month after the Summit in a format prescribed in a contractual agreement with SANCIDF

Achievements

Due to the poor attendance of the online presentations of GDC, no reports were received to date. Efforts will continue to obtain reports, especially from SC members and other attendees who did attend the presentations. These reports will be included in the annual reports that will be submitted at the 2022 AGM of SANCIDF. These reports will be printed and distributed to all Milk SA levy payers as a channel to provide meaningful feed-back to the local dairy industry
